KENNY CLARKE & HIS 52nd STREET BOYS NYC. Sept. 5, 1946 Fats Navarro, Kenny Dorham (tp), Sonny Stitt (as), Ray Abrams (ts), Eddy De Verteuil (bar), Bud Powell (p), John Collins (g), Al Hall (b), Kenny Clarke (dm). Four titles were recorded for French Swing/Victor, two have baritonesax:

There is nothing from EDV's early career that should include him in this bebop session with several of the most prominent modern performers. Nevertheless he takes two good and relaxed soli with great confidence, fitting naturally into the proceedings.

BE BOP BOYS

NYC. Sept. 6, 1946

Personnel as 52nd STREET BOYS above except Morris Lane (ts) replaces Abrams, Collins out. Gil Fuller (arr).

Four titles were recorded for Savoy, two have baritonesax:

3348/49	Fat Boy	Soli 24, 12, 12 and 12 bars. (FM)
3348-alt.	Fat Boy	Solo 24 bars. (FM)
3350/51	Everything's Cool	Solo with ens 32 bars. (M)

Busy week for these musicians and EDV is still with the group that recorded the day before. Also here he demonstrates that he has good knowledge of the modern concepts under current development. On "Fat ..." he trades blues choruses successfully with the other saxes, while on "... Cool" he is almost drowned in the trumpeters' riff. EDV still has a lot to learn but seems to have a good potential, unfortunately he is never heard from again, so we will never know. Postscript of Nov. 2019: Note an alternate take of "Fat Boy"'s first part, including EDV's first solo.
